

Parts of Speech "Cheat Sheet"

NOUN	Names : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • person • place • thing • idea 	<i>Mr. Smith, boy, student Chicago, classroom, street cup, door, chair love, fear, bravery</i>
PRONOUN	Replaces <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a noun • pronoun 	<i>I, you, he, she, we, it, they us, them, me, her, him myself, himself, themselves mine, ours, yours, who, whom...etc</i>
ADJECTIVE	Describes <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • noun • pronoun 	<i>The red house... The huge dog... The young man... The bright hope...</i>
VERB	Expresses: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • action • state of being • linking 	<i>The dog ran... The clock ticked... The apple fell... I am happy... She was excited...</i>
ADVERB	Describes <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adverbs • Adjectives • Verbs 	<i>The boy sang <u>very loudly</u>. The pizza was <u>too</u> hot... He arrived <u>late</u>.</i>
PREPOSITION	Relates <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a noun or pronoun to another word in a sentence • location, time, comparison 	<i>The dog sat <u>under</u> the table. The mouse ran <u>through</u> the door. <u>Over</u> the river you can see my house.</i>
CONJUNCTION	Joins <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • words or groups of words in a sentence 	<i>Teachers <u>and</u> student work together. I would go, <u>but</u> I have work. Sue <u>or</u> Beth can drive you. I hope <u>neither</u> you <u>nor</u> I have to stay longer. Bob <u>either</u> you study now <u>or</u> later.</i>
INTERJECTION	Expresses <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • interjects strong feelings 	<i><u>Oh, no!</u> I can't let you do that. <u>Oops</u>, the door slammed. <u>Ouch!</u> The cat scratched me. <u>Goodness!</u> The snow is two feet deep.</i>
